Rudy Vargas, from Marti Emerald's office, announced the city's resolution of an alley paving situation in Azalea Park. He stated that Marti is working on arranging funds for security cameras at the Azalea Park Recreational Center. She is also working on arranging funds for the Canyonlands group canyon maintenance. He said also that the final treatment of Marti's cancer treatment is pending.

Ivanna Heard, from Senator Ben Hueso's office, said that his office managed to donate 1,000 turkeys to those in need. Senator Hueso championed Senate Bill 1228, recently signed by Governor Brown, which continues the state's Trade Corridors Improvement Fund (TCIF) facilitating investments for transportation and trade corridor infrastructure improvements between California and Baja California.
