

Notes from the Azalea Park Neighborhood Association

Meeting of November 11, 2014

Hector Borja, Teen Director for the Copley-Price YMCA facility which will have its open house celebration on January 3, 2015, announced that the festivity will be open to the entire community. He said that charter memberships are on sale now and that programs are available for those needing financial assistance to join. He is working with schools to get students involved in the teen programs. The facility will offer meeting spaces to the public also. This new facility will be the largest YMCA facility in the city of San Diego.

Felicia Shaw reported on the Pop Street Project and handed out a flyer/workshop overview report detailing results from the brainstorming exchange of the kick-off celebration held on November 1st. A calendar of planned events for the next six months will begin with various landscaping projects and also bus-wait seating structures. She stated that between January and June of 2015 we will receive our Azalea Park identification sign.

Jim Martin stated that we are entering the design phase of the landscape effort and that folks may join the design team. The first meeting will be December 13th from 9AM-11AM at his home to decide on what plants to utilize and that this will include parkway plantings.

He said that efforts will be made to encourage residents of Poplar Street to exhibit Christmas decorations and that on December 13th a team will walk Poplar Street to determine the winner of a \$25 prize for best decorated residence.

The December 9th APNA meeting will be a holiday potluck.
